Student Internship Procedure: Administration of Applied Research and Innovation

- 1. Faculty advisors (or their designate) will connect regularly with Applied Research and Innovation (ARI) Interns to provide discipline-specific guidance, supervision and mentorship support, and on the job training.
- 2. As supervisors, faculty will strive to:
 - Clearly set out expectations
 - Ensure Intern time tracking and reporting compliance
 - Provide guidance
 - Provide timely feedback
 - Be accessible
 - Help Interns to understand policies, regulations, and best practices
 - Promote academic integrity
 - Provide a supportive and inclusive environment
 - Avoid conflict of interest

3. As mentors, faculty will strive to:

- Enable and support development of knowledge and skills related to Intern field of studies as opportunities present
- Provide Interns with the opportunity to hone their collaborative skills
- Give Interns the tools necessary to deal confidently with intellectual challenges
- Allow Interns to become contributing members of a wider community of scholars
- 4. Interns, in consultation with their advisor, will fulfill the following requirements to earn their Certificate of Completion:
 - Minimum 400 hours of time-tracked Selkirk Innovates work experience for full internship or 60-80 hours for micro-internship;
 - Learning Plan
 - Regular attendance and participation at meetings and learning events
 - Mid-Point Learning Reflection
 - Final Report (or other agreed upon deliverable) & Learning Reflection
 - Social Media Post
 - Complete evaluation surveys post-, and 6 months following internship
- 5. All Intern employment opportunities will be posted on the Selkirk College website, and attempts to encourage marginalized populations to apply will be prioritized.
- 6. Regular learning, networking, and knowledge dissemination opportunities will be provided.
- 7. In an effort to foster a climate of inclusion, innovation, and interdisciplinary research, faculty advisors and Interns are encouraged to use software tools to enable virtual collaboration and/or spend time working together on campus.



8. Project budgets will reflect approximately15-45 hours of Faculty supervisory and mentorship time for each internship as informed by project complexity, partner expectations, and student ability.
